What is ACDF

One option for treatment is called anterior cervical discectomy and fusion. We call it ACDF, and I would say that is the most common operation nationwide, probably worldwide, for treating herniated disc surgery. It is very popular because it works. It is time tested. The results are outstanding, and it is very safe. In order to do this procedure, we need to make an incision in the front of the neck and then we go right down to the spine, which is only $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches down and we remove the disc that is called the anterior discectomy and then we fuse the bones together and that is the part what we call discectomy and fusion, ACDF. This provides stability to the spine, also decompressing the spinal cord. It is an excellent procedure, which is safe, and with good results.
